The Roswell Independent School District is the eighth largest district in the state, serving a student population of approximately 10,500 with an ethnic mix of 71% Hispanic, 26% Anglo, 2.4% Black, .8% Asian, and .4% American Indian. Through the Long Range Planning process, the community continues to endorse the neighborhood schools concept. Hence, we have twelve elementary schools serving students in kindergarten through grade 5; one Early Literacy Center serving preschool students; four middle schools serving grades 6, 7 & 8; two comprehensive high schools, and one alternative/early college high school.

Educators in the Roswell school system believe that children should receive a well-rounded education. The world is ever changing; therefore, education is subject to changes according to youth needs. Children must be able to meet the challenges of the society in which they will function. The Roswell schools approach this challenge by assuring that each child is offered a sound program regardless of race, religion, or socio-economic status.
