Performing Arts First Grade

Lesson 13 Disco

Arts Standards & Common Core Connections

Students will learn about the disco dance era and it's benefits. Students will be able to play a short piece using Boomwhackers in an ensemble-like setting. They will be able to read basic notation, and count and follow along in basic time-signatures.

Lesson / Instruction / Narrative

Teacher will begin the lesson by singing the "Hello Song." Teacher will introduce "Disco" by showing pictures from the 70's disco era. Teacher will turn on the disco ball while students learn steps to the song, "YMCA." Students will be introduced to the Boomwhacker. Teacher will teach students that the Boomwhackers have different notes and pitches. Students will learn the safety of Boomwhackers as well as playing them properly. Students will choose the note/color they want to try. They will follow a simple Boomwhacker warm-up video. After they have learned how to successfully use the Boomwhackers safely and properly, they will try to follow along to 2 Boomwhacker songs. Teacher will visually assess the students and help any students who are not understanding the rhythm. Teacher will close the lesson with the "Goodbye Song."

Teacher will use many visuals and will model how to use the Boomwhackers. Teacher will walk around the room, helping individual students.
