Building Community in a Virtual Classroom

In this session, teachers will explore a variety of ways to build community within their virtual classroom. While many traditional strategies can be adjusted to the virtual classroom, teachers must thoughtfully consider what adjustments must be made to ensure that relationships and trust are built in this virtual environment. This session will also allow teachers. to consider innovative ways to build classroom community, using a breadth of resources available to educators and students. Ensuring all students find their voice and place in the virtual classroom is the crux of this workshop.



Engaging All Students in a Virtual Classroom

This session will give teachers time to explore the variety of engagement strategies that are useful in the virtual classroom, as this setting is vastly different than the in-person classroom. Recognizing those differences and considering strategies to enhance instruction and opportunities to interact with the learning will take center stage as: teachers expand their repertoire to ensure all students have access and interactions with the content.



Successful Communication in a Virtual Classroom


Being able to communicate effectively is an essential life skill for all students. This session will investigate the process of how students can express ideas and feelings in a way that promotes positive and successful interactions with others. Some topics to be explored are how to speak clearly, have a strong voice, body language, and tone. Teachers will also discuss the impact of communication in a digital world; how miscommunications occur when people misread digital messages. Additionally, strategies

classroom will be explored.



Strategies for Supporting Language Learners in a Remote Teaching

Environment

Roadblocks like language barriers and vocabulary knowledge can make teaching even more challenging in a virtual environment. This session will review best practices to support English Language Learners in a virtual environment, including strategies to bridge the gap between content and language. Also explored are new ways to engage English Language Learners with complex text and word learning.



Tackling Complex Text in a Virtual World

Students need to access rich, challenging text to develop knowledge, build vocabulary, and improve comprehension across the content areas. As students tackle difficult text, a wide breadth of effective strategies are needed to uncover meaning and build students' skillset. Throughout this session, educators will discover nuances within text that make it difficult and uncover student-centered ways to support vocabulary knowledge and development. Participants will encounter and practice strategies to empower students to conquer challenging text and thrive in this virtual learning environment.



Infusing SEL into Current Classroom
